


- C. Prorupted states: access or disruption


- D. Compact states: efficient


- E. Landlocked states

 - -3. Water boundaries












- D. Frontiers
 - –1. A zone where no state exercises complete political control
 - −2. Historically, frontiers separated states.



FRONTIERS: ARABIAN PENINSULA

 - a. A country that is run according to the interests of the ruler rather than the people
 - –2. Anocracy
 - b. A country that is not fully democratic nor fully autocratic
 - −a. Displays a mix of the two types of government
 - -3. Democracy
 - c. A country that is run according to the interests of the people




REGIME TYPE, 2010

Element	Democracy	Autocracy
Selection of leaders	Institutions and procedures through which citizens can express effective preferences about alternative policies and leaders.	Leaders are selected according to clearly defined (usually hereditary) rules of succession from within the established political elite.
Citizen participation	Institutionalized constraints on the exercise of power by the executive.	Citizens' participation is sharply restricted or suppressed.
Checks and balances	Guarantee of civil liberties to all citizens in their daily lives and in acts of political participation.	Leaders exercise power with no meaningful checks from legislative, judicial, or civil society institutions.

Trend towards democracy




- B. Local government

 - a. Allocates most power to the federal government
 - b. Local governments have relatively little power
 - -2. Federal state
 - a. Strong powers are allocated to units of local government

- A. Military alliances
 - -1. North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO)
 - -2. Warsaw Pact
- B. Economic cooperation
 - –1. European Union
 - -2. COMECON

- C. Superpowers
 - –1. Balance of power
 - a. A condition of roughly equal strength between opposing forces




U. S. MILITARY VEHICLES AND AIRCRAFT LINED UP ON THE TAXIWAY AT CAMP SPEICHER, IRAQ
